

5. PARTICIPANTS

All Championship participants must:

1. Be a citizen of the Country you seek to represent. World Aquatics rule I.3.1.1





- 2. Be a member federation duly constituted and affiliated to the CCCAN Confederation World Aquatics Rule 1.2.1
- 3. The Federation must be up to date with its membership fees.
- 4. The teams that participate in these championships must do so in the name of the country from which they come, with the understanding that they are members of the Confederation through their respective Federations.
- 5. Participants who are not members of a CCCAN National Federation must receive approval and authorization from both their National Federation and the affiliated Zone. Said approval must be signed by the President or Secretary of the National Federation and presented to the Secretary of the CCCAN.
- 6. Non-citizens may register as long as the competitor has resided in the country for at least one year prior to the registration deadline and must not have swam for another country during that period. All competitors must be registered or be members of the Swimming Federation of the country they represent. Non-citizen competitors will be required to present "proof of residency" documents which could be proof of club membership, proof of attendance at school or any other organization. If a country enters a competitor who is not a citizen of that country by birth or naturalization, that country code will be changed by adding "AG" as a suffix to the designated three-letter World Aquatics country code and will be used throughout the competition. competition, MEX will change to MEX-AG.
- 7. Proof of age through an official birth certificate or passport from the country they represent.

6. ACCREDITATIONS

Each participating country has the right to include the following team officials in its official delegation:

- Delegations of five (5) competitors or less will be allowed two (2) team officials.
- Delegations of six (6) to ten (10) competitors will be allowed three (3) team officials.
- Delegations of eleven (11) to twenty-four (24) competitors will be allowed four (4) team officials.
- Delegations of more than 24 competitors will allow five (5) team officials.

8. MINIMUM OF PARTICIPATING COUNTRIES

To hold a "Championship" in all disciplines and their respective categories, the participation of at least two (2) countries is required. If a discipline and/or event does not reach the required number of countries, the Organizing Committee will notify the President of CCCAN:

Acting on the recommendation of the president of the Technical Committee, the CCCAN President will take appropriate measures to eliminate these events.

11-12 YEARS

Competitors 11 to 12 years old at midnight on December 31, 2023. Athletes born in 2011 and 2012 can participate.

13-14 YEARS

Competitors 13 to 14 years old at midnight on December 31, 2023. Athletes born in 2009 and 2010 can participate.

15-17 YEARS

Competitors 15 to 17 years old at midnight on December 31, 2023. Athletes born in 2006, 2007, and 2008 can participate.

18 YEARS AND OVER

Competitors 18 years and older at midnight on December 31, 2023. Athletes born 2005 and earlier.

(b) Final Entries:

REGISTRATION RULES

- A. Each country can enter four (4) swimmers in the preliminaries. Only two (2) will be able to advance to the finals for each individual event. Each country can enter only one team in the relays.
- B. There is no limit on the number of events in which a competitor can be entered.
- C. No alternates or substitutes will be allowed for individual events.
- D. In relay events, each country may enter four (4) competitors, but each member of the country, duly entered in the championship, may be a substitute. All relays must be entered along with the Hy-Tek individual event file no later than **May 17, 2023**.
- E. No competitor may participate outside his or her age group.
- F. The order of swimmers in relay events must be delivered to the control table no later than one (1) hour prior to the start of the session in which the event is swum.

RULES

The Championships will be governed by the World Aquatics rules in force at the time SWIMSUIT, GOGGLES AND SWIM CAPS





Swimsuits, goggles and swimming caps used will be those approved by World Aquatics and must be on the current "approved" list published by World Aquatics each year. These dress rules apply to both preliminary and final events and must be branded as approved by World Aquatics.

INTERPRETATIONS

The members of the CCCAN Executive Committee present at the championships will have full authority to respond and resolve all interpretations, resolutions or appeals related to these championships.

TECHNICAL OFFICIALS

The President of CCCAN, with the recommendation of the President of the Swimming Technical Committee for each discipline, will appoint the judges and referees for the championships with the understanding that at least 90% will be provided by the host country. "CCCAN member and guest federations may nominate up to a maximum of two (2) technical officials" for this Championship. Technical Officers will be accommodated in double rooms, but will be charged the CCCAN rate which includes local transportation and three (3) meals per day.



The President of CCCAN will notify each Federation and the Organizing Committee of the names of the technical officials selected to work in the championships.

AWARDS

1) A championship trophy will be awarded to the country with the highest score in each age group (male and female).





- 2) An overall championship trophy will be awarded to the country that obtains the total score.
- 3) Each award must have the logo and initials of CCCAN, and the design must be approved by CCCAN.
- 4) Medals will be awarded for first to third place in each event: gold, silver, and bronze, respectively. Each medal will have the initials of CCCAN, and the design must be approved by CCCAN.
- 5) In the relay each of the 4 participants will receive a medal.

Prizes will be presented at the awards podium, as determined by the Organizing Committee in consultation with the President of CCCAN or his nominee. The flags of the first three (3) places will be raised and the anthem of the winning country will be played

PROGRAM

- A) The swimming preliminary heats will be held in the morning and the eight (8) finalists will be selected based on time. The finals will be held in the afternoon. There will be a Final A and a Final B. The following parameters apply to these finals:
- 1. Final A will be composed of the first 8 eligible swimmers and 2 alternates. Swimmers must be from CCCAN member countries and guest countries.
- 2. Final B will be composed of swimmers who qualify from position No. 11 to No. 18. They may be from CCCAN member teams and CCCAN guest countries, swimmers from non-CCCAN member countries, and guest swimmers.
- 3. Swimmers from Final B are not eligible as alternate swimmers to Final A.
- 4. In events over 200m, if there are two or 3 swimmers tied for 8th position for Final A, seeding will be done according to World Aquatics Competition Regulations (current version) 3.1.1.7





- B) The 800 and 1500 M freestyle event, the 200 M butterfly event and the 200 M breaststroke event in the 11-12 age group, and the 400 M individual medley event, in the 13-14 age group, will be swum as "finals by time" and will be seeded in accordance with World Aquatics Rule 3.1.1.6. All entries in these events must show "proof of time" (name and date of the competition in which the time has been met) when entered into the HYTEK file. If evidence is not presented, the swimmer will not be registered.
- C) The 800M & 1500M freestyle events will be swum in the 13+ category but will be awarded separately.

All swimmers or their coach or team delegate, in the final scheduled timed events (200m breaststroke and 200m butterfly 11-12, 400m individual medley 13-14 and all 800/1500m freestyle), must report to the seeding judge in the heat session on the day of the event to take into account any athlete who does not wish to participate and secure swimmers for the finals. Each eligible swimmer will swim the event only once (in the morning or finals session).

CLASSIFICATION COMPETITION-WORLD AQUATICS EVENTS

The following applies to this competition as it is a qualifier for other World Aquatic Events:

- **1.** Those events that are removed due to lack of participation, according to the CCCAN Summon's, <u>will not be added</u> to the event program. The teams will be informed as soon as possible if this situation arises.
 - 2. Those events that have 8 or fewer swimmers at the time of withdrawals in the technical meeting, according to WA Rule 3.1.1.1, will automatically advance to finals. Those events that, after the technical meeting, have more than 8 swimmers but at the time of the eliminatory, less than 8 appear, will be swum according to the seeding in the eliminatory session (they will not automatically go to the finals).

DATE AND PLACE OF COMPETITION

The Open Water Swimming competition of CCCAN 2024 Championship will be held in Monterrey City, Mexico, from June 23 to 29, 2024 at the El Cuchillo State Park facilities.

- 3) Although the official deadline for preliminary registrations is **April 26, 2024**, it would be greatly appreciated if this information is sent as soon as possible to allow proper planning of local transportation, hotel accommodations any fine-tuning that may be needed.



4) Final entries

Final entries must be submitted by midnight on <u>May 17, 2024</u>. CCCAN and the organizing committee will provide final entry forms and instructions to all invited teams. Participating countries must send their final HYTEK Entries with the Federation seal by email to the following:

The HYTEK registration form will be provided by the organizing committee 1 month before the registration deadline date.

ENTRY RULES

- A. Each country may enter a maximum of three (3) competitors in each individual event; masculine and feminine.
- B. All competitors must be subject to a medical physical examination in the host country prior to their event. The time and place of this review will be communicated to each delegation at the technical meeting.
- C. Competitors between the ages of 12 and up to 17 will only participate if they are represented by their parents or by their country's delegate at the championships. The competitor's representative must sign and include with the entry form a document exonerating CCCAN and the host federation from all liability.
- D. It is mandatory that each swimmer be accompanied by a companion during the competition. An accompanying representative can accompany a maximum of 2 swimmers. If you do not have a representative from your country accompanying you, you must request a companion from the Organizing Committee during the technical meeting. E. You can participate both as National Teams from each country, as well as as Clubs under the same criteria established in points A to D.

Additional explanation for relays:

- · Relay events will be held in each category.
- Mixed relay teams must have 4 athletes, 2 men and 2 women.
- Mixed relay teams can be composed of two athletes who are not participating in the open water events and the remaining two must be registered in one or both 3k (if the category applies), 5k and 10k events.





- The distance for changing athletes during the relay race will be 20 meters.
- ° The members of the relays in the 12-13 year old category will swim 1,250 meters each.
- ° The members of the relays in the 14-17 and 18 and older categories will swim 1,250 meters each.

REGULATION

The Open Water Swimming competition of this Championship will be carried out in accordance with CCCAN Statute, and the World Aquatics Regulations in force. To clarify any doubts or divergences regarding these rules, the English version will prevail.

Cases that are not under the rules will be resolved as follows:

- a) General cases will be resolved in accordance with the Statute and Regulations of CCCAN.
- b) Technical issues will be resolved in accordance with the World Aquatics Regulations.

RULES

The Championships will be governed by the World Aquatics rules in force at the time of the competitions.

SWIMSUIT, GOGGLES AND SWIMMING CAPS

Swimsuits, goggles and swimming caps used will be those approved by World Aquatics and must be on the current "approved" list published by World Aquatics each year. Swimming caps must show the three (3) identifying letters of your Country.

COMPETITION/TECHNICAL ORGANIZATION

The CCCAN Technical Commission and the Members of its Executive Committee will be in charge of presenting the circuit to the participants.

Open Water Swimming races will be held at a distance of 3 - 5 and 10 km, in individual events, depending on the Category in which the athlete participates.





In the Relays, the distances will be 4 km for 12 - 13 years old (each athlete will swim 1 km) and 5 km for the remaining categories (each athlete will swim 1,250 m). All events in FreeStyle.

Because the competition date is still distant, we have not been able to define either the length or the shape of the circuit. In accordance with the physical conditions of the place, its depth, water temperature, possibilities of wind and currents and security means available by the Organizing Committee, these aspects will be defined, which will be informed to you as soon as possible.

INTERPRETATIONS

The members of CCCAN Executive Committee present at the championships will have full authority to respond and resolve all interpretations, resolutions or appeals related to these championships. The CCCAN TOWC has the exclusive decision to authorize the participation of any athlete registered in the 10k considering the results obtained in the 5k test, even if they have been officially registered by the federation in the 10k.

All competitors will have the opportunity to train and familiarize themselves with the competition course one (1) day before the first race.

Depending on the number of participants, the technical committee will decide what type of start will be used.

Other matters of interest regarding the rules will be discussed at the Technical Meeting prior to the competition.

PARTICIPATION

Only National Federations recognized by CCCAN, duly affiliated will have the right to register their athletes in this Championship.

- 5.1. In individual events by Category, each Federation will have the right to register a maximum of 2 athletes in the Female gender and 2 athletes in the Male gender.
- 5.2. In Relay events, Federations may only present 1 Team made up of 2 Female athletes and 2 Male athletes. The order of departures will be according to the team's strategy, but always respecting the order in which they appear on the registration form, which must be delivered by the Team Delegate 1 hour before departure.
- 5.3. Of the 4 athletes that make up the Relay Team, at least 3 of them must have participated in individual events. Therefore, when delivering the Relay team registration to the table, the Delegate must wait for the approval of those athletes and deliver a copy of their registration, to be signed by the Technical Committee Member designated for this purpose.





MINIMUM PARTICIPATION

For an event to be considered official, three (3) athletes and an equal number of National Federations must participate.

In the event that one or more federations after the Technical Meeting are held are unable to participate for reasons beyond their control, will verified by (CCCAN) who is the only one authorized to authorize the holding of the event.

TECHNICAL OFFICIALS

The President of CCCAN, with the recommendation of the Technical Committee of each discipline, will appoint the judges and referees of the championship, with the understanding that at least 90% will be contributed by the host country. "CCCAN member and guest federations may nominate up to a maximum of two (2) technical officials." For this Championship, referees and starters must be on the World Aquatics List of Swimming Officials #14 and #15. Technical Officers will be accommodated in double rooms but will be charged the CCCAN rate in quadruple accommodation for local transportation, accommodation and three (3) meals per day.



The President of the CCCAN will notify each Federation and the Organizing Committee of the names of the technical officials selected to work in the championships.

JURY OF APPEALS

The Appeals Jury will have a CCCAN Delegate along with any of the members of the Open Water Technical Committee present. The CCCAN Delegate will be the president of the jury.

PROTESTS AND APPEALS

Protests must be made within a period of 30 minutes after the cause of the protest is known, and will be presented in writing, accompanied by \$500.00 USD, by the Team Delegate to the Head Referee of the competition in accordance with rule GR9. 2. of the International Swimming Federation.

If they do not agree with the response given by the Head Referee, the Delegate may Appeal to the APPEALS Committee for technical matters. The Jury will be made up of the Central American and Caribbean Swimming Confederation (CCCAN), the Technical Committee and personnel nominated by CCCAN.

The jury will receive appeals according to World Aquatics rule GR9.3 and their decisions will be final.

For the resolution of protests and appeals, the provisions of the current World Aquatics Open Water Regulations will be applied.





RULES FOR PARTICIPATION

- Each participant in the championship must be a member of a club which must be duly federated or be a national team of a Federation.
- All Clubs affiliated with their federations can participate in the invitational event.
- All invited federations that do not belong to the CCCAN area can participate in the invitational.
- All clubs that do not belong to the CCCAN area can participate in the invitational.
- Each Federation will send a single entry with all its participation (Clubs and National Team).





- Each country and/or club can register three (3) male and/or female solos, three (3) duets, three (3) mixed duets and one (1) team per age group. (combined, acrobatic and team).
- Teams must each be composed of a minimum of four (4) swimmers and a maximum of eight (8). There can be a maximum of two men on each team. World Aquatics Rule AS18.1 will apply.
- The Combined routine must be composed of 4 to 10 swimmers with a maximum of two males.
- The acrobatic routine only for Juniors and Seniors can be made up of 4 to 8 swimmers with a maximum of two men.
- No competitor may participate outside his or her age group, even in a higher category.
 - 15-year-old athletes can only participate in two categories maximum
 - The female of the mixed duet can also swim the female duet.

CATEGORY CHANGE:

1. When a Junior athlete moves up a category (Senior) in Solo, Duet, Mixed Duet and/or Team, he/she may NOT compete in those events in his/her own age category.

2. Junior athletes can compete in both categories, but not in the same event. Example...Junior Free Solo and Senior Technical Solo

JURY OF APPEAL

RULES

The Championships will be governed by the World Aquatics rules in force at the time of the competition.

SWIMSUITS

Swimsuits in routines must comply with GR 5 and AS 13.9 A 13.12

TECHNICAL OFFICERS

The President of the C.C.C.A.N., with the recommendation of the Technical Artistic Swimming Committee, will appoint the judges and referees of the championships as well as the controllers, with the understanding that at least 90% will be contributed by the host country. Additionally, the Federations participating in these championships must include a minimum of two (2) technical officials in their delegation.

It is mandatory that each participating Country send two (2) judges. At least one (1) judge must be a World Aquatics or Pan Am Aquatic judge who passed the World Aquatics Judging School (2022 – 2024 Schools). These judges will have priority on the panels.

We make the call to the federations to promote being controller within their national judging corps.

- For Group 3, prizes will be awarded separately for both the technical routine and the free routine.

There will be two award ceremonies: one for the participating clubs and another for the participating National Team. The Clubs will not add points to the National Teams Nationals. The trophies will only be for the National Teams that participate and are awarded points.



Awards will be presented on the awards podium as determined by the Organizing Committee in consultation with the CCCAN President or his/her designee. Medals will only be awarded to the first three (3) places. The flags of the first three (3) places will be raised and the anthem of the winning country will be played. Each participant will receive the prize corresponding to their country.

The final entries, by discipline, must be in the hands of the Organizing Committee, no later than midnight on <u>May 17, 2024</u>. The host country will not be responsible for the expenses incurred by the person or persons who personally deliver the final entries.

REGISTRATION RULES

- A. Each country may enter a maximum of two (2) competitors in each individual event.
- B. There is no limit on the number of events in which an individual competitor can participate.
- C. No alternates or substitutes will be allowed in individual events.
- D. No competitor may participate outside of an age group, even in an older one.
- E. The exact list of events must be submitted for each competitor.
- F. You can participate as both National Teams from each country, as well as Clubs under the same criteria established in points A to E.





RULES

The Championships will be governed by the World Aquatics rules enforced on the date of these.

INTERPRETATIONS

The members of the CCCAN Executive Committee present at the championships will have full authority to respond and resolve all interpretations, resolutions or appeals related to these championships.

TECHNICAL OFFICIALS

The president of the CCCAN, with the recommendation of the Technical Committee for each discipline, will appoint the judges and referees for the championships, understanding that at least 90% will be provided by the host country. The federations participating in these championships may include in their delegation a maximum of two (2) technical officials per discipline. Warrant Officers will be accommodated in doubles, but will charge the quadruple rate for local transportation, lodging, and three (3) meals per day.

In diving, it is mandatory for each participating country to send one (1) judge if the team has four (4) or more divers. Countries with fewer than four (4) divers may bring one judge. The forms with the names and experience of each technical official must be sent to the president of the CCCAN no later than **April 26, 2024** to the following email address:

The CCCAN will notify each federation and the Organizing Committee of the names of the technical officials selected to work in the championships. The Championships will be governed by the World Aquatics rules in force at the time of the competitions.

AWARDS

A championship trophy will be awarded to the country with the highest points in each age group (male and female) in each discipline and category. From first to third place medals (gold, silver, bronze, respectively) will be awarded for each event in each discipline. Each medal will have the initials of the CCCAN and the design must be approved by the CCCAN.



Medals will be awarded at the end of each test, on the awards podium, as determined by the Organizing Committee in consultation with the president of CCCAN or his candidate, where only the first three places will go. The flags of the first three places will be raised and the national anthem of the winning country will be heard.

Independent scoring will be maintained in each discipline, category, and gender to decide who will be the team champions. The diving program will follow World Aquatics age group (DAG) rules and exceptions authorized by World Aquatics.

- 1. All competitions will be final.
- 2. World Aquatics (DAG) age group rules will apply to A and Free groups without exceptions.
- 3. For group B the following will apply: 1- and 3-meter trampoline.
- Platform: Women and men will only compete from the 5 meters to 7.5-meter platform.

Each competitor must compete with 4 dives with a limit, selected from different groups, with the total degree of difficulty not exceeding 7.6 and 2 dives without limit of degree of difficulty, selected from different groups.
