



## **CRITERIA – PanAm Aquatics Championships (Colombia) 2025 Age Group 13-15 (2012-2010)**

1. Final selection must be ratified by the ASAJ Council.
2. Swimmer must be a Jamaica Citizen.
3. Swimmers must be registered with the ASAJ a minimum of three weeks prior to the start of the last local qualifying meet.
4. Times swum July 1, 2024, or after in the year of competition will be considered. Meets that are not fully contained within the qualification period but fall on a boundary date will be included. The final date for qualification is March 22, 2025.
5. Times must have been swum in a long course meet sanctioned by the ASAJ or other AQUA recognized body.
6. Swimmers must qualify in at least two (2) events.
7. The swimmer must be ranked first, second, or third in the event in which the standard is achieved.
8. Qualifying times:
  - a. Latest TUSS AAA time standards.
  - b. The 8th place median of the last three years of CCCAN in events where there are no TUSS standards.
  - c. For 13-15 (2012-2010), the 13-14 AAA TUSS Standards will be used.
9. If only three(3) swimmers have automatically qualified in an age-group, a fourth swimmer (meeting the AAA qualifying criteria) will be selected to be part of a relay team whose combined times as determined by Hy-Tek would match or better the median 8<sup>th</sup> place for the event over the last three (3) years of CCCAN.



10. If there are four (4) automatic qualifiers in a particular age group an additional relay swimmer could be selected to be part of a relay team whose combined times as determined by Hy-Tek would match or better the median 8<sup>th</sup> place for the event over the last three (3) years of CCCAN.

11. All relay teams will be selected based on a combination of swimmers that equals or better the 8<sup>th</sup> place median time of a relay event over the last three (3) years of CCCAN, irrespective of being automatic qualifiers. In the absence of any such combination, the automatic qualifiers will be selected to swim the relay event.

12. If the number of automatic qualifiers in an age group exceeds nine (9), which is the maximum allowed as per the summons, swimmers will be ranked according to the number of events for which they qualified (AAA qualifying time and ranked in the top 3 in any event) and then by World Aquatic points to select the nine (9).
